The Big Issue Street Soccer National Championships Corporate Cup Sunday, July 19, 2009

Since 2004, The Big Issue's Street Soccer Program has supported people experiencing homelessness, substance abuse or disadvantage. It gives players an opportunity to get fit, make new friends and seek support and advice. Importantly, it offers a mechanism for social change.

With 17 programs currently running in WA, SA, VIC, NSW, NT and QLD, our goal is to host 30 programs by the end of 2010.

The Big Issue is delighted to offer you an opportunity to enter a team in the 2009 Street Soccer Corporate Cup.

This round robin style tournament is a unique experience, giving employees the chance to get active, increase team morale and build their social awareness by interacting with members of the community they would not usually meet.

Captained by participants of our Brisbane Street Soccer Program, your team will compete with other corporate teams in five-a-side, 15 minute street soccer games played in a giant 16 x 22m inflatable pitch.

After the Corporate Cup you'll join the Street Soccer players in a penalty shootout competition before the Street Soccer National Championships kick off at 1:30pm.
